Free Negroes in Cumberland County, 1837–1839

Contributed by John S. Hopewell, Ph.D.**

Three lists of free Negroes residing in Cumberland County in 1837, 1838 and 1839 were recently found among that county's Free Negro and Slave Papers located in the Library of Virginia. What appears here is a compilation of all three lists that included numerous duplications from year to year. The list for 1837 is the most extensive, while the list for 1838 gives residents' ages more often than the other two. The list for 1839 often provides additional information as to occupation or place of residence.

Emancipation that Mayo's Executors had printed on vellum, they received personal passes describing their physical characteristics. The passes then could be shown to the county patrols that nightly roamed the community checking on the movements of free Negroes and slaves. The vellum certificates and many expired passes are also located in the Free Negro and Slave Papers of Cumberland County Court Records at the Library of Virginia.
