## A List of the Free Negroes Rockingham County, Virginia: [1815]

Transcribed by Dorothy A. Boyd-Bragg, Ph.D.\*

The original list is written on the last, unnumbered pages of a book maintained by George Huston and others in Rockingham County, Virginia, for the recording of taxes in 1815 and 1816. While the list of free Negroes itself is not dated, internal evidence within the tax lists themselves indicates that it was compiled in 1815 rather than in 1816. It has not been microfilmed; the original is at the Rockingham County Courthouse in Harrisonburg, Virginia.
